### Subdivision Garage Sale

1. The garage sale for the sub is set for May 18, 19 and 20 this year. All residents are encouraged to participate if they so choose either all or any of the days. The notice of the sale will be placed in the local newspapers and signs at the entrance to the sub will be posted.

### Underground Piping

1. Underground piping, perhaps storm water pipe collectors from residents homes has broken and flooded the backyards of homes on Elkhorn and Cumberland. The question was asked whether this repair would be borne by the subdivision or by the residents where the break has occurred since the Subdivision had collected a special assessment for the repair of the detention basins. No one knew the answer to the question but thought the homeowner(s) might bear the cost since the break is on private property. Paul Franklin will research this issue.

### Subdivision and Commons Spruce Up

It is our understanding that they will again attempt to cut the weeds in this area once the weather dries the soil.

The desire is to hopefully get those who have procrastinated thus far to get off their porches and help make the neighborhood a little nicer. Bernie will make fliers and pass them out.

### School Children using Backyards as Short Cuts

1. A request was made of the Board to send a letter to Gary Cornish, principal of Hamlin Elementary, asking for an announcement be made to the students of the school informing them that they should not take short cuts through the yards of residents so they need not walk to either Cumberland or Juengel to get to Prospect. Ed Murphy moved the sub approach Mr. Cornish with a request this information be put in the children's Monday Notes so that both they and their parents may be advised. The motion was seconded by Vic Bolterstein and passed unanimously.

### Street Light

1. A lack of a street light at the corner of Juengel and Hamlin Road has some residents concerned. Vic Bolterstein reported that the city has no policy to install street lights at such intersections in spite that it is also the point of entry to Hamlin School.

2. Vic Bolterstein proposed asking the Association for Juengel Orchards to go in half with us in having a light installed at this point.

3. Ed Murphy suggested that a proposal be drafted and circulated throughout the sub requesting of city council to have a light installed at this point. John Gaber will write the proposal and Patty Knoblock volunteered to circulate it.

### Subdivision Property Transfer

1. Larry Cojocari turned over to Vic Bolterstein the portable bag telephone and rechargeable flashlight the subdivision purchased when there was an active residents patrol several years ago. Vic will store this equipment.
